The Brave Phone program has been continuously implemented since 1997. The national helpline for children operates under the free and anonymous European harmonized number 116 111. This service is available every working day from 9 AM to 8 PM.




COUNSELLORS: Senior students and graduates from helping professions (social work, psychology, pedagogy, and Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation Sciences) are specially trained to provide telephone counseling for children and parents.

In 2023, 83 volunteers participated on the childrens helpline.

USERS: children and adolescents

HELPLINE: From January 1, 2023, to December 31, 2023, Brave Phone for Children received a total of 1,031 calls. Out of these, 391 calls required further processing.

Distribution of calls on the topic of mental health - the most represented categories of calls in 2023

Brave Phone for children was most often called for topics related to mental health difficulties (48%), abuse and violence (43%), information seeking (31%), family relationships (28%) and peer relationships (18%).

When it comes to mental health calls, the difficulties involved were:

- Suicidality (24%)
- Self-harm (18%)
- Depression (15%)
- Anxiety (12%)
- Loneliness (9%)
- Panic attacks (5%)

Brave Phone for Moms and Dads (0800 0800)

The Brave Phone program, which has been continuously implemented since 2013 on the number 0800 0800.

Brave Phone for Moms and Dads is a free, anonymous and confidential helpline that parents and other adults can call to seek support and help for their child and family.

Working hours: every working day 9-20 hours



COUNSELLORS: senior students and graduates of the faculties of helping professions (social work, psychology, pedagogy, Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation Sciences), specially trained to provide telephone counseling for children and parents.


In the year 2023, 83 volunteers volunteered.

USERS: parents, experts in working with children, other adults concerned about children in the area.

From 01.01.2023. until 31.12.2023. we received 1,222 calls, of which 923 have been processed.

The Brave phone for Moms and Dads was most often called for the topics of family relationships (63%), abuse and violence (36%), school-related topics (23%), psychosocial difficulties and mental health of children and young people (18%) and developmental difficulties (17%).

- Parent-child relationship (27%)
- Divorce and parental conflict (25%)
- Parenting advice (14%)
- Custody problems (9%)
- Addictions or mental illnesses of parents

The Brave Phone for Moms and Dads is most often called by female adults (81%), most often mothers, but also other adults concerned about the child's well-being.

E-SAVJETOVANJE

Status: the Brave Phone program, which has been continuously implemented since 2009.

E-counseling is available via e-mail, chat, forum or Facebook. Counselors are available live on chat every afternoon, while other e-counseling channels can be contacted at any time. A response is expected within 3 working days.

Working hours of the chat: every working day from 15:00 to 19:00.



COUNSELORS: senior students and graduates of the faculties of helping professions (social work, psychology, pedagogy, Faculty of Education and Rehablitiation Sciences), specially trained to provide telephone counseling for children and parents.


In 2023, 62 volunteers volunteered at the e-counseling program.

USERS: children and young people, parents, experts in working with children, adults concerned about children in their environment.

In 2023, a total of 1,540 inquiries were received from children, their parents, experts who work with children and other adults.

When it comes to e-counseling, the largest number of children and young people contact Brave Phone via chat, with 49% of inquiries (748) received via chat. More than 57% of queries are advisory (281) or informative (145).

Another channel of written communication available to users is the e-mail. Of the total number of inquiries received, 98% go into further processing, and more advisory (453) than informative (244) inquiries were received.



Of the total number of inquiries received via e-counselling, 3% came via Facebook (42 inquiries) and 2% via the Brave Phone forum (cybermed.hr, 35 inquiries).

COMMUNITY CENTER BOROVJE

Status: the Brave Phone program, which has been continuously implemented since 2001. Children's House Borovje (since 2020 Community Center Borovje) is an example of good practice in strengthening the local community, and among its activities it offers preventive - socialization workshops, speech therapy exercises and individual help with learning.

Location: Ulica Bože i Nikole Bionde 7, Zagreb.

Working hours: every working day 9-20 hours.

All activities carried out by volunteers (preventive-socialization workshops, learning assistance and speech therapy exercises) are held once a week, lasting 60 minutes.



VOLUNTEERS: mostly students of helping professions (social work, psychology, social pedagogy, etc.) with completed education on group/individual work with children.

In the work of the Community Center Borovje in 2023, 70 volunteers were involved who completed more than 3,000 volunteer hours. USERS: children from 4 to 18 years old, parents and cooperating organizations.

In 2023, the activities covered more than 520 direct beneficiaries and more than 9000 indirect beneficiaries in the community.



Preventive - socialization workshops

The program provides participants with creative and age-appropriate content aimed at early prevention of behavioral difficulties. Mandatory contents of the program are communication, self-esteem and self-care, family and peers, tolerance, social awareness and responsibility - prosocial behavior and activity in the local community.

The program is also aimed at strengthening the capacity of the local community and providing support to parents by monitoring the children's progress. It is continuously evaluated internally and externally and networks with other institutions in the local and wider community, to provide comprehensive and quick support and assistance.

In the year 2022/2023 **54 participants** were enrolled (54% boys, 46% girls), divided in 8 groups , 4 each for preschoolers and 4 for schoolchildren.

In the year 2023/2024 **47 participants** (54% boys, 46% girls) were enrolled, divided in 8 groups, 4 each for preschoolers and 4 for schoolchildren.

Socialization, creativity and fun







Help with learning and speech therapy exercises

Children are included in the mentioned programs on the recommendation of experts and school teachers or on their own initiative by parents/guardians. Learning assistance is aimed at developing learning skills and techniques, encouraging motivation and shaping/maintaining the child's work habits. Speech therapy exercises are aimed at children with learning, reading or writing difficulties.

In the school year 2022/2023, **24 children** were enrolled in these individual programs (19 for learning assistance and 5 for speech therapy exercises) (54% boys and 46% girls). The average age of participants of learning assistance is 11 years, while the average age of participants of speech therapy exercises is 6 years.

In the school year 2023/2024, **27 children** were enrolled in these individual programs (21 for learning assistance and 6 for speech therapy exercises) (63% boys and 37% girls). The average age of participants in learning assistance is 12 years, while the average age of participants in speech therapy exercises is 6 years.

COOPERATION WITH BOROVJE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

With the aim of identifying the needs of the local community and achieving high quality services within the Borovje Cummunity Center, during 2023 numerous collaborations were realized with Borovje Primary School, such as marking relevant dates such as "International Family Day", "Pink Tshirt Day", "World mental health day" and similar. In addition to such events, cooperation with the school included regular referrals of users to the work of the Center, holding workshops, etc.

POWER OF FAMILY

The Brave Phone program, which has been continuously implemented since 2004.

Family strength includes:

- individual and family counseling for children and parents
- School for Parents program
- workshops to strengthen children's social competence
- workshops to strengthen the psychological resilience of children - victims of domestic violence

Location: Community center Borovje, Bože i Nikola Bionde 7, separate coordination

Working hours: Mon-Fri, 8am-8pm



In 2023, a total of 108 users were included.

ADVISORS:

mental health experts (psychologists, social workers, pedagogues, social pedagogues), educated or in education in a psychotherapy field, under mandatory supervision and continuous professional training.

USERS:

children and young people (from 7 to 18 years old), parents or other guardians.

ASSOCIATES:

coordination team of the Community Center Borovje, preschools and primary schools in the local community, Center for Social Welfare, other related civil society organizations and health institutions.



Levels of prevention in the Counseling Center:

- primary work with children and parents from the general population
- secondary work with children at risk, single-parent families, families in the process of divorce/divorced parents and families at risk referred from the centers for social welfare.
- tertiary work with users with a moderate or high level of risk referred from the centers for social welfare, who already have a measure of family legal protection and those who have been temporarily deprived of parental care with the aim of preventing the separation of children from the family, as well as providing help in achieving the conditions for the return of the child to the family.

Activities:

- 75 parents and 33 children were involved in individual and family counseling; total of 400 consultation meetings were held.
- 2 cycles of the School for Parents program; total of 21 parents (14 mothers and 7 fathers) were included in the school for parents.
- 1 cycle of workshops to strengthen children's social competence was conducted, where a total of 6 children (4 boys and 2 girls) were involved.

Networking and collaboration:

The counseling center is an active member of the informal Network of psychosocial counseling centers for users at risk, formed within the framework of the ACF project that began in 2021. together with 15 civil society organizations in the area of Zagreb and Karlovac County).

Workshops to strengthen children's social competences:

TEAM MEMBERS: Mental health experts (psychologists, social workers, pedagogues), volunteers - final year students of auxiliary faculties on the phone lines, and educational rehabilitators and social pedagogues who conduct assessments of sensory integration.

USERS: Parents and siblings of children with developmental disabilities and children with developmental disabilities.



In 2023, a total of 20 users was included.

In addition to the already mentioned services, in this first year of implementation, additional education for volunteers on the topic "Autism Spectrum Disorder" was organized.

Assessments of sensory integration:

- 9 children and their parents participated in the assessment of sensory integration. The children are aged from 1.5 to 3 years.

Responding to peer violence in school


Status: From January 2021 to March 2023, the two-year project "REVIS - Responding to peer violence in school" lasted, which was carried out in the territory of five countries of Southeast Europe. In addition to Brave Phone, the organizations Terre des Hommes from Romania, the Center for Youth Integration from Serbia and the Social Activities and Practice Institute from Bulgaria participated in the project, while it was coordinated by Terre des Hommes from Hungary.

The main goal of the project was to prevent and respond to peer violence among children by transforming social and gender-based norms and behavior; to create a safe environment for children in which they will be able to challenge existing social and gender norms that lead to peer violence and encourage them to use their influence in society to develop solutions to the aforementioned difficulties.

10 schools that participated in the project :

Total of 419 children participated in the project, 20 facilitators, 2 national trainers and three external collaborators experts in media publications and children's participation.

During 2023, the following activities were carried out as part of the project:

- webinars titled Child-led Solutions to Combat Bullying (international webinar in English), Cyberbullying: What do we know and what can we do? (international webinar in English) and When students create solutions - campaigns against peer violence (national webinar in Croatian) - webinar recordings are available on the ChildHub platform
- the final conference of the project was held in Budapest
- the remaining campaigns created as part of the project were implemented



Media campaigns by children

Secondary school Jastrebarsko

The students walked in a procession through the main square of the city and thus marked the Day of Pink Tshirts. In the parade, for the first time in front of their fellow citizens and the local community, they performed the song Reci nasilju "The end", which they created as part of the REVIS project - responding to peer violence in school and extra-curricular environments.





Split Health School

Students of the Split Health School launched their campaign "I'm not afraid to say!" they focused on providing assistance to those who experienced violence or were witnesses. Their goal was to provide their colleagues with a safe place where they could confide, but also receive adequate help and support through the response they would receive to their message. In the hallway of their school, they set up a box with a QR code that leads to the online platform Padlet where they can leave an anonymous message. The received inquiries will be answered by the professional service of the school (psychologist and pedagogue) and the team of students that cooperates with the professional service. To promote their campaign, the students recorded a promotional video in which they briefly described their campaign, its goal and how it came about.




Winners

Gymnasium Vukovar

In their campaign "Erase the negative, write the positive!", the students of the Vukovar High School decided to conduct a social experiment in the corridor of their school to point out the importance of empathy in interpersonal communication and highlight the weight and seriousness of the insults they unfortunately encounter every day.

The students performed the performance in the school lobby. Four students (models) were standing in the lobby of the school in identical, black clothes with blindfolds and derogatory words written in red on the exposed parts of their bodies. Wet wipes and blue body paint stood next to the students. Part of the students (involved in REVIS), as an example to others, approached the models and wiped off the derogatory word with a wet tissue and wrote a new, positive message or compliment in that place. Following that example, other students also started to get involved - approaching the models, erasing derogatory words and writing nice words. During the performance, a professional videographer captured footage that was later compiled into a promotional video.



A Network of cooperation for the realization of children's well-being and rights

Status: The project is being implemented from October 2022 to February 2024.

The purpose of forming the Network of Associations for the Protection of Children's Rights is to strengthen the cooperation and civil capacity of society organizations to monitor public policy for children, which will influence the better protection of children's rights the and empowerment of vulnerable groups, children and their family members, through involvement in researching needs, informing legislative about rights and framework and a public campaign aimed at the whole community.





The project holder is the Children's First Association, and the partner associations are Brave Phone, Ardura, SOS Children's Village Croatia and SOS Children's Village Norway.

In addition to the project partners, 14 other associations from all over Croatia are included in the Network: Association Prevention (Nova Gradiška), Children's Creative Center "Dokkica" (Osijek), Association Breza (Osijek), Society "Our Children" Opatija, Association Sidro (Rijeka), Magic World (Knin), and from Zagreb Sirius Center, Ambidexter Club, Society for Psychological Assistance, HURID - Croatian Association for Early Intervention in Childhood, Association of Societies "Our Children" of Croatia, Association Igra, Association Krijesnica and Association of Parents "Step by step".











During 2023, the members of the Network participated in theoretical educations and the practical process of analyzing and monitoring public policies:

Through 6 focus groups with children from risk groups and their parents, a needs analysis was conducted, and a psychosocial counseling service was selected as the scope of public policy for analysis and monitoring in cooperation with the state and civil society organizations.

In the cycle of education and supervision meetings under the leadership of prof. Anke Kekez Krišto from Faculty of Political Sciences, the methodology of monitoring the selected public policy was defined, research instruments were created, qualitative data was processed, and the structure of the report and policy brief was formed.

The project team conducted 23 interviews with counselors and organizers of psychosocial counseling services from civil society organizations and various public administration bodies with which associations cooperate, and analyzed laws, regulations, tenders and other relevant documents that cover and define this service. The results of the analysis will be presented at the project's final event in early 2024, and the resulting report and policy brief will be used in further advocacy activities to improve the availability and quality of the service.

Programs and

Empowerment of vulnerable groups

As part of activities aimed at empowering vulnerable groups, the project team developed and conducted 4 workshops for children and their family members with the aim of raising awareness of the issues and rights of vulnerable groups, informing and encouraging active engagement in exercising rights and inclusion in community life. The workshop program is available for implementation by all members of the Network.

Brave Phone held a workshop with the users of the Community Center Borovje in which 12 children and parents participated.

At the beginning of 2024, a leaflet will be distributed, and a public campaign will be launched, which will inform and educate children from vulnerable groups and their family members about the existing ways of support through the services offered by members of the Network.

The CARES project aims to:

- examine the extent to which children's rights are respected in crisis situations (pandemic, earthquakes, economic crisis)
- to empower experts for better implementation of children's rights in their work,
- inform children about their rights and encourage them to participate,
- advocate children's rights and recommendations for their improvement



In 2023, a workshop program was designed for participatory work with children and youth on the topic of children's rights in times of crisis. All partner countries conducted 2 cycles of 4 workshops each, and Brave Phone cooperated with UD Dora Pejačević, where 19 girls were involved in the workshops. After the workshops, the girls conducted 5 interviews with their peers to explore their experiences in times of crisis.

2 more follow-up meetings and 2 additional workshops were organized with the participants, where, in cooperation with an external participation expert, ideas were developed for tools that would inform children and young people and encourage them to participate.





A survey was also designed for professionals working with children and young people, which sought to identify work challenges and examples of good practice during the crisis. We conducted 2 focus groups and 4 thematic interviews with 11 participants and collected 30 responses to an online questionnaire. Each partner country conducted a national survey and presented the data in a national report that will form one common report for advocacy activities. In addition to expert data, the report also includes data from interviews with children and young people.



The joint results of all partner countries refer to an increase in mental health difficulties in children and young people and inadequate response of the system, then lack of opportunities for participation of children and young people and insufficient capacities (human, financial) for implementation service for supporting children and young people.

Based on the results, a training program for experts will be designed to meet the needs and challenges of future crisis situations. Part of the training will be led by young workshop participants so that the voice of young people can be heard.

In December 2023, a partnership meeting was held in Vienna, where all partners referred to past activities and national research results and planned activities for the coming year.



CARING

Rethinking social and gender norms to reduce violence against young people in school

Project implementation time: from 1.5.2023 until 30.4.2025.

General goal of the project:

Raise awareness of the gender dimension of violence against young people in schools and review social norms by implementing a preventive program through which young people will be sensitized and empowered for necessary changes and for developing solutions.



In May 2023, Brave Phone published a call for participation in the project. Eight schools were selected based on criteria such as previous involvement in similar activities, school needs and motivation for participation.

In June 2023, representatives of Brave Phone participated in the kick off meeting in Bucharest.





During November 2023, Brave Phone organized a three-day training for 16 facilitators from selected schools. The goal was to equip them with the skills and knowledge to, based on the Curriculum, conduct education for school staff and training for young leaders - students who will lead the design and implementation of initiatives to reduce gender-based violence. In 2024, there will be education for school staff, students and parents, as well as the design and implementation of initiatives led by children.



In order to create the Curriculum manual on the prevention of gender-based violence in schools, as part of the project, research was conducted in 32 schools in Bulgaria, Croatia, Greece and Romania, on attitudes and behaviors related to gender-based violence. Key findings and recommendations were analyzed in the Regional Report and integrated into the aforementioned manual.

Improving the system of providing direct help and support to women and children victims of gender based violence from Ukraine in Croatia

In February 2023, the last in a series of three-day trainings was held, this time the training of trainers "Working with children, adolescents and women victims of gender-based violence", which was attended by a total of 26 representatives of relevant institutions (institutions for social work, police, Children's dom Zagreb, Ministry of Labour, Pension System, Family and Social Policy, Health Centers, etc.) and representatives of civil society organizations.

With this training we ended the project, in which a total of **72 experts** who work for the welfare of children in the Republic of Croatia participated.



MY FOLLOW UP -

strengthening the support system of child victims of violence in Croatia

Status: the project is implemented in cooperation with the Ministry of the Interior. It started on April 1, 2023 and will last for two years.

During 2023, as part of the project, cooperation was achieved with 8 police stations of the City of Zagreb.

The specific goals of the project are:

- to contribute to systematic changes at the national level of protection of child victims of violence through the implementation of a monitoring system for child victims of violence
- design and implement more effective ways of supporting child victims of violence so that support is provided in a timely manner and in accordance with the individual needs of the victim,
- to improve the knowledge, skills and capacities of experts who are the first in contact with child victims (police, experts of the advisory line for children) in preventing, detecting and reacting to violence against children, and
- increase cooperation between relevant services (police, national children's hotline) in the field of providing help and support to child victims of violence.

As part of the project, questionnaires were designed to measure user satisfaction with our service on advice lines, e-counseling, and questionnaires intended for users of the My follow up project. The implementation of the impact assessment started on 1 October.





Dodatne aktivnosti na projektu

Kick off with project partners

Representatives of Brave Phone and Ministry of Interior met on April 27 to mark the beginning of the project. The agenda of the meeting included the presentation of the participants, the presentation of the project and its activities by work packages, and the definition of the next steps related to the implementation of the activities.





The employees of Brave Phone attended the kick-off meeting of the projects that were selected within the CERV-2022-DAPHNE and CERV-2022-CHILD tenders. The meeting took place on May 16 and 17 at the Albert Borschette Center in Brussels.

Study visit to Ireland

Representatives of Brave Phone and Ministry participated in a study visit to child protection associations in the Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland. The study visit included a visit to the Garnerville Police Academy in Belfast, Northern Ireland, where a protocol on cooperation between the police and the social welfare system was presented. This was followed by a visit to the Association for the protection of victims (Victim support Northern Ireland), where programs for providing support to victims of criminal offenses were presented. We also visited the Irish Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (Irish Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children) in Dublin, where the employees of Brave Phone had the opportunity to exchange experiences in the operation of helplines, as well as other programs and projects.









Meetings with police stations

During September and December, meetings were held with the police stations of the City of Zagreb. With III., V. and VII., we started the referral system on October 1, while we will start with the remaining five stations on January 1, 2024. The purpose of the meetings was to present the project and to agree on the method and dynamics of cooperation. During the meeting, the employees of the police stations received all the necessary information about the project activities, dynamics and methodology of our cooperation.

A new beginning – the expansion of social services of Brave Phone The House was built during the year, the opening and moving in are expected in the middle of 2024!



The project was financed by the European Union within the framework of the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), the European Social Fund (ESF) and the Cohesion Fund (CF) for the period 2014-2020, and the total value of the project is HRK 8,356,002.03 including VAT (1,109 032.06€ with VAT.)

Volunteering on Brave Phone

Through stimulating activities for young people, such as acquiring knowledge, skills and experience while working directly with the population that interests them professionally and socializing with each other, Hrabri telefon encourages the development of volunteering in the area of the City of Zagreb. Here it is important to point out that most of the involved volunteers, even though they are studying in the City of Zagreb, are not from that area, and after completing their studies, they return to their places of origin. In this way, our voice is heard much further, and good practice is transferred to places where it is also needed.

Out of the total number of volunteers, 111 of them volunteered at the Children's Helpline/Moms and Dads Helpline/E-counseling program and 70 at the Borovje Community Center program.

In total, 81 supervision meetings and 9 additional educations were held on the counseling line and e-counseling programs, and an additional 6 educations and 40 supervisions were held on the Borovje Community Center program.

Education for new volunteer leaders of prevention-socialization workshops and PPU leaders

During June 2023, the selection and training of new volunteers for the leaders of prevention and socialization workshops was carried out. 14 new volunteers were trained through 7 trainings that dealt with topics such as "Communication in a group and group roles", "Co-leadership - partnership in working with children", "Authority and conflict resolution" and similar.

The selection and training of new volunteers to help with learning was also carried out. 14 new volunteers were trained through 7 trainings that covered topics such as "Establishing a relationship with a child", "Techniques and learning styles", "Creative ideas for working with children" and others.

New volunteer leaders of preventive and socialization programs are included in the mentoring program through 5 mentoring visits throughout the year. Each co-leading couple got their own mentor, an older volunteer with experience, who came to the group throughout the year and gave the new volunteers feedback and support in their work.

Before the first arrival at the group, the volunteer-leaders and the mentor met for a mutual introduction in an informal atmosphere, so that the first arrival at the group would be as relaxed and less stressful as possible.

In school year 2022/2023 included 7 mentors who mentored a total of 16 volunteers, and in the school year 2023/2024 4 mentors were involved who mentored a total of 12 volunteers.

Education of our new generation of volunteers on childrens helpline

In March 2023, training for new volunteers on the counseling lines and e-counseling began on Brave Phone. Interested persons sent their applications by filling out the application via e-mail, and selection interviews were conducted during January and February. The goal of the interview was to meet those interested and to examine their motivation for joining our team, and 44 applicants were selected for inclusion in the training. In March and May, they were listening older volunteers on the helplines, and during April they listened to basic education, and in May and June they had their first shifts accompanied by mentors to be ready for independent volunteering at our helplines and the e-counseling program .



Topics of basic education in working with abused and neglected children and basic counseling techniques: Basics of counseling, Counseling interview, Communication skills, Emotionally disturbing calls, Parent counseling, Abuse and neglect, Bullying and cyberbullying, E-counseling, Chat counseling and Multidisciplinary approach in protect children.


